

2013 CLD Officers' Reports

President's Report

Our 40th Anniversary celebration at the 2013 Annual Meeting and Awards Banquet was quite lovely.

The audience enjoyed the presentation of pictures and video clips portraying members and horses from throughout CLD's history. Because the committee took extra care with the flower arrangements, door prizes and favors, and special cake, our room at Illini Club was especially pretty..

Now, as we have just completed our 41st year, we continue to work on increasing membership and providing programs and shows. Our numbers increased slightly from 88 to 95.

The Board developed a policy for subsidizing clinics. The first one, which was held at Pratense Farm in April, was conducted by Melanie Michalak. It was a joint CLD – Pony Club venture which CLD subsidized for young riders and adult amateurs. We picked up several new youth members by sharing this clinic with Pony Club. Melanie exposed the riders to musical freestyle which was lots of fun for all.

The Board sent out a Membership Survey in February 2013, requesting input for programs and volunteers for specific projects. Several members indicated willingness to host a social event and to volunteer at IceBreaker, Firecracker, and Classic.

We designed a new logo for CLD clothing and have begun to sell several styles of shirts, sweatshirts, hats and visors. Terri Zeal volunteered to handle clothing this project.

Challenges for 2014 include:

- training scribes (we had difficulties finding enough scribes to work at Classic)
- finding a crew willing to learn how to set the rings for Classic
- the current crew has retired keeping or increasing membership

Happily, Classic continues to make a profit for the club. Without that we would not be able to subsidize clinics and the Banquet, donate money to USDF (\$500.00 for the convention which is in our Region this year) or The Dressage Foundation, defray some clinician expenses, send a delegate to the USDF Convention, or provide awards.

2013 Classic was held on Aug 24 & 25 with judges who were both new to Classic, Elizabeth Madlener & Joan Humphrey. The show had 76 horses from 4 states attending. 250 rides were scheduled with 229 actually ridden from Training through Gran Prix. We once again had a Friday evening buffet that was well attended by exhibitors & friends. This year we switched to an "ice cream social" for Sat afternoon which was supplied and staffed by Kim Jones and family & friends. This idea seemed to be a winner for future years. The net revenue for 2013 was over \$3,000. Exact amounts are always difficult because we pay ahead some expenses and some club expenses are pro-rated by the various shows. For 2014 the dates are Aug 23 & 24 with Arlene Rigdon and Pamela Wooding as judges.

Goal: Open up a line of communications with other GMO clubs to foster sharing of information and collect demographic information.

Recap: As with any dynamic position, there was a fair amount of updating as all clubs have new officers and contacts. All was updated and communications set in place with the new club officers. Updated leadership, welcomed the infusion of new contacts as an avenue with which to expand their audience as well as increase their opportunities for shows and clinics.

Results: The concept, to share of information about upcoming club events, shows dates, clinics, education opportunities and newsletters, has proven successful, from a grass roots perspective. Adding the shared information to the websites and newsletters of each club has opened the window for a variety of opportunities.

This year we are missing two of our former 'partners'. Lincoln Trails and Little Dressage are no longer viable GMOs with USDF. Also, some simple membership metrics were collected.

Below are the six clubs with which communications are currently maintained. Next year, I would like to add several more clubs, based on their distance from Springfield:

IDCTA - IL Dressage & CTA	membership increase
Great River Classical Horsemanship Association	membership decrease
SLADS - St. Louis Area Dressage	membership increase
IDS – Indiana Dressage Society	membership increase
Michiana Dressage Club	membership increase
The Dressage Company	membership decrease

Collectively, the average membership increase was 29.5%. Collectively, the average membership decrease was 26%.

Future: The hard work and research has been completed and communications established. The future focus of this position will be to continue to build the level of communications with the clubs as well as to encourage all clubs to share, and take advantage of shows, clinics, forums and symposiums sponsored by other clubs. This could involve co-sponsoring, sponsorships, volunteering and physical participation.
