

As in years previous the CLD website usually gets its highest level of traffic around the time of CLD Classic I & II. The change of date of Classic shifted the most populous traffic with June 2015 now being the most trafficked time for the website.



Facebook & Twitter

CLD's FaceBook page continues to grow people with 441 people "liking" CLD and following updates there up from 229 the previous year. CLD's Twitter has 28 followers, also up from previous years. CLD's Facebook & Twitter efforts are spearheaded by Lisa Lehr and occasionally assisted by Martin Kuhn. Traffic spiked to 1735 page views in June, noticeably up from the peak at Classic last year.
