CLD Website, Newsletters, and Social Media

CenterLine Dressage Website

The new, updated website was launched in March of 2023. Analytic information from the old site did not transfer to the new. However, from the launch date of the new site, CLD has had 2.1k visits. 1.6k were unique visitors indicating that we had a healthy mix of returning and new visitors. Additionally, we have had 4.6k page views meaning on average, each visit resulted in two different pages being accessed.

The most successful month for the website was June with 500+ visits that month, corresponding with Classic and people checking their scores and the photo galleries from the show.

The majority of the traffic came to the website directly. The second most common way people found our website was through searches. The two most common search terms were CenterLine Dressage and CenterLine Dressage Shows. These two terms represented 70% of our search traffic.

Ninety-one percent of our traffic is from the United States with Illinois, Missouri, Indiana, and Ohio representing the top geographic areas. Four percent of our traffic comes from Canada and the remaining 5% of traffic is coming from China, Saudi Arabia, United Kingdom, India, and France.

Social Media

CenterLine Dressage maintains one social media account on Facebook. Our followers have grown to 912 which is a 68% follower increase over last year's report. While CLD does have a Twitter account, to my knowledge we have not been posting to it. With the issues Twitter, now X, is having and the fact a post on that particular platform has a life expectancy of 8 minutes, it is my recommendation the account be officially closed. We will never be posting enough or have enough content to make the platform a viable option for us.

Emails

We have been sending out eblasts to our member list and those who sign up through our website via Mail Chimps free account. The mailing list currently has 123 subscribed contacts. We sent out 15 eblasts from March through October, including newsletters in March, May, and September. We have an impressive open rate of 55%, well above average for eblasts.
